



COLLECTION OF URINE SAMPLES IN CATS

- Keep doors, windows and catflaps shut to prevent outdoor access.
- Place a clean litter tray in a secluded spot away from excessive noise.
- Empty the contents of 1 sachet of Katkor beads into the litter tray.
- It is often necessary to persist for up to 24 hours before your cat will use a litter tray if they normally go outside to urinate. He or she may show signs of wanting to go outside during this period. If however, he or she begins to seem distressed or starts passing small drops of urine on a frequent basis it would be best to allow the cat outdoors and repeat the process on another day. If signs of distress or difficulty in passing urine persist please contact the surgery for advice.
- Once your cat has successfully passed urine on the Katkor beads, use the enclosed pipette to remove the urine from the tray. Gently squeeze the urine out of the pipette into the enclosed tube.
- Bring the urine sample to the surgery for analysis as soon as possible. If necessary the urine sample may be stored in a refrigerator for up to 2 hours before bringing in, but fresh urine gives more accurate results.
